CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2023

The year ended 31 December 2023 has produced a record Net profit of \$443010. This result is the result of a successful Tennis program which continues to expand through under the management of our Tennis Director Glen Jackson. Glen and his team are always looking to expand the operation through dedication by tennis coaches and more recently working closely with our Tennis Committee. Glen's professional approach continues to impress.

Given the state of our tennis program we are currently seeking to acquire leaseholds within the Neutral Bay area to cope with expansion as we are currently limited to four courts.

Under the concerted efforts of our General Manager, Peter Lewis, the Club has expanded Function income by attracting additional traffic through corporate events. Our strong financial position has permitted repairs and maintenance to be concluded in the area between the main Club House and the Bowls Pavilion. This has permitted expanded seating which allows for greater capacity.

The DA application was lodged with North Sydney Council in December 2023 for the new structure that will replace the Bowls Pavilion. Again, our strong financial position will ensure that the build cost will be paid for out of cashflow. It is our intention to apply for Grants in regard to this structure once the DA has been approved. Grant applications will only be considered once the DA has been issued.

Our next major Capex once the Tennis/Bowls pavilion is complete will be an expansion of the Clubhouse. This may result in an application to have the land rezoned which will have the effect of increasing Net Equity position of the Club.

Our Club continues to expand through strategies adopted by the Board and implemented by Peter Lewis and his team. One of the important features in any business is to have strong leadership and staff backup. Peter and the staff of the Club have managed to achieve this in spades and they are to be congratulated for their efforts.

The Club's lady bowlers continue to impress in tournament play and again are to be congratulated for the efforts and results. The Bowls report attached to the Financial Report expands on their achievements during the year.

At the AGM held in May 2023 I was re-elected President. The following Directors were re-elected:

This has also permitted additional suggestions and resolutions to streamline our IT operations which are so important to the daily running of the Club.

Finally, I wish to thank fellow Board Members for their tireless work and council during the year and they should be proud of their achievements.

NBC General Manager and Secretary Report 2023

2023 Financials:

As many of you may be aware, I resigned from the NBC Board and started volunteering at the club in Jan 2019 and consequently took on the GM role.

After a decade of losses, the Club declared a loss of 218K in 2019. Since then, we have recorded a profit each year including this year. In 2023 we increased turnover to 2.4m whilst generating an operating profit of 443k, a new NBC record. This was achieved despite losing \$350k in food revenue in comparison with previous year (prior to Lusso contract); that is replacing that revenue with more profitable income in 2023.

These results, together with a healthy balance sheet, enable the Board and I to be more strategic and forward-looking in 2024/5.

Operational investments and improvements:

New Two Storey Development

This project is all about improving facilities for member use long-term and honouring the sporting heritage of our club (rather than revenue raising in recent years). As most of you are aware, based on feedback post AGM, a one-story replacement building did not fit the requirements of our sporting members for now or in the future; feedback sessions included comments re: more bowls space/lockers/storage; a viewing gallery and practice wall for tennis members, grey water collection, solar roofing and the addition of M/F toilets/change rooms for members use only and a separate tennis/general storage area.

The FINAL design was presented to all members and sporting committees, via GM updates and other individual and group consultations in Aug/September, having been approved by the Board. We drafted an Environmental Impact Submission in September, and the DA and associated documentation were submitted in October 2023, with a view to commencing construction in winter 2024. In anticipation of associated council visits to NBC our fire exits/fire equipment and evac procedures were updated and all licensing requirements were checked current/compliant. The total concept brief, design development, consultation, documentation, and DA submission costs were 22k.

Phone Network/Hardware Upgrade

NextGen has upgraded our systems to the Cisco Network/NBN/Hardware (the existing Panasonic system was no longer supported); the upgraded package is 20% cheaper than existing charges, will function during power outages and allow full mobile compatibility via Cisco app (\$225 pm).

Tennis Court Repairs/Improvements

Repairs to nets/fencing and remodeling of the viewing terrace including umbrella and furnishing – 13k. The relocation of the power substation from behind tennis Court 2 and relocated onto the council grass verge on Anderson st and removal of the old substation

and brick enclosure (which was reported to AUSGRID as a structural risk) completed Jan 23.

IT Infrastructure Improvements/Upgrades (Ralph)

Ladies Ext/Ambulant Toilet

NBC was successful in achieving a CPD 30k grant for this project: Submission Number: CBP22 – 0185; final drawings/prep work/completed 30/9/23 and project completed December 2023 – Total project cost \$38k.

Landscaping and New Outdoor Furniture

One of the most significant improvements this year was the landscaping works and new Jarrah furnishing to the northern end of the bowls rinks, totalling 60k. This resulted in being able to double our outdoor seating resulting in significant revenue increases from July onwards and positive feedback from all concerned.

Marketing and Communications Improvements

Our marketing effort continues to go from strength to strength – some major achievements include:

A continued strategic focus on the local community and Neutral Bay Public School and many other private North Shore Schools with a high level of repeat business from various admin depts., social gatherings and end of year celebrations.

Our long-term relationship and sponsorship with Di Jones Real Estate and Piers van Hamburg continues with renewed interest and signage.

A much improved and stronger online presence (including the NBC website, Google profile, Facebook and Instagram channels) with a substantial increase in real followers, greater website traffic and a subsequent increase in user engagement.

Google business reviews have been constant with an outstanding 4.4 Star review rating (compared to the Oaks 4.3, Greens 3.8, and Mosman Rowers 4.0).

My sincere thanks for the support in 2023 to every Member, NBC Board Members, our sponsors, our local schools, community families and in particular, *every* staff member at the club for their contributions and loyalty this year.

NEUTRAL BAY BOWLING CLUB

Annual Report 2024

2023 saw the unification of the Neutral Bay Men's and Women's Bowling Clubs. This process followed the unification of the Men's and Women's sections at state level (Now known as Bowls NSW). In 2022 both Neutral Bay clubs had voted overwhelmingly to become one club. Unification required the Board's approval for minor amendments to the Club's Constitution and Bowls By laws and acceptance from Bowls NSW.

A new management structure was put in place and following due process a Management Committee was elected to provide leadership to the bowling sector. This committee comprised of Trish Wilson (chair). Paul Maybury (deputy chair and selector) Caroline Gracie (secretary) Keith Pogue (shared secretarial duties and Match) Belinda Henderson (Match) Jenny Hepburn (Selection) and Jenny Palmer (Policy and Compliance) have met monthly. Their task has been to build relationships across the sections and to work towards building a cohesive and successful club where both men and women participate equally in both the organisational and playing aspects. Their belief has been that a good club is not so much about achievement in competition but rather the spirit that exists within the club- the fun on and off the green, the friendships formed and the concern for the welfare of individuals. This continues to be "work in progress."

Current membership stands at 64. Full / competition membership is 51 (33 women,18 men) and 13 have elected to join as social bowls members (4 women, 9 men). The Management Committee remains committed to building up the number of active male bowlers.

Saturday morning social has been well supported by both the men and women and members report that they have greatly enjoyed the mixed bowls. Women continue to play Wednesday mornings and men in the afternoon. The collegiality that follows games is an important part of our "new" club.

The club fielded a strong mixed team in the Zone Open Pennants and did well, narrowly missing out on winning their section IN Grade 5. There was no Women's or Men's Pennant competition in 2023 as Bowls NSW reorganised their playing calendar from July – June.

Pleasingly we had a number of our newer bowlers participate in the Zone Rookies competition and whilst they were defeated by more experienced bowlers they were great ambassadors for our club.

Once again the club was well represented in District events by the women. With one exception there were Neutral Bay players in the final of every event. This would surely set a record for the District. The Fours Team of Elaine Seidler, Jenny Palmer, Kate Wingrove and Jenny Hepburn won the Fours for the fourth successive year and went on to win the Regional play off. This enables them to enter the State championships to be played in Dubbo in March 2024. Other notable successes were Jenny Hepburn who won the District singles and Jenny Hepburn, Kate Wingrove and Elaine Seidler the District triples. Although these players narrowly missed out at the Regional level these results were a source of great pride for our club. A few of our men played in the zone events and it is our hope that their participation will grow in the years to come.

Our annual Invitation tournament for women across the Region held in October was once again an opportunity to showcase our club. The feedback indicated that the players appreciated the hospitality and sense of welcome as much as the bowling tournament. The Management Committee has committed to restart the Peter Russell Memorial trophy in 2024 after a year's hibernation.

The Club championships were played over the year and for the first time we played an open event – the Over 70's. A beautiful old trophy donated by J MacDougall Anderson in 1960 had not been contested since 1992. It was won by Graham Atkins.
